Collection for World Central Kitchen

You've probably noticed that The Committee on Ecology and Social Action (CESA) is holding an ongoing campaign to raise funds for World Central Kitchen (WCK). The yellow and blue collection can is back on the coffee hour table. WCK provides emergency, on-site, around-the-globe, food relief in the form of cooked meals. Last church year our focus was Ukraine. BUUC donations in change and bills added up to a generous \$463 from March through June.

We have not forgotten Ukraine, but this year donations in any amount will go directly to WCK to use at their discretion. Recently they have been in Hawaii following the horrific fires, and mobilized in western Florida even before the hurricane struck.
